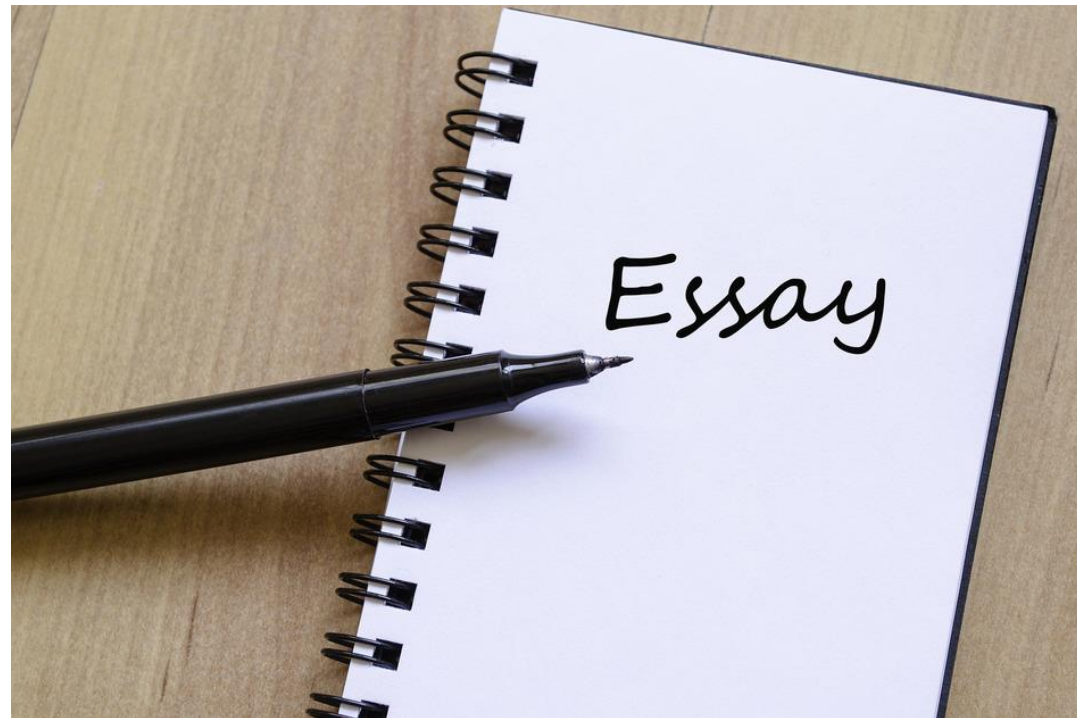

- State your opinion (if required)

2) Main body paragraph 1 – Advantage

- Topic sentence – state 1 advantage
- Explanation – give detail explaining the advantage
- Example – give an example

3) Main body paragraph 2 – Disadvantage

- Topic sentence – state 1 disadvantage
- Explanation – give detail explaining the disadvantage
- Example – give an example

4) Conclusion

- Summarise the key points
- State your opinion (if required)

Essay Structure 2

1) Introduction

- Paraphrase the question

2) Main body paragraph 1 – Advantage

- Topic sentence – give an example
